

Statement of Educational Services for Students with Veterans Studies Benefit

ICPR Junior College is approved by the Veterans Educational Services Approval Agency to provide academic training to students under the various GI Bill® programs. The Institution is authorized to enroll veteran students and their beneficiaries referred by federal and state agencies. They must meet all admission requirements in addition to those related to their status as a beneficiary of the appropriate agency in the federal or state program. The Office of Veterans Affairs states that recipients must complete their program of study within the regular time of the program (100%). In addition, you must maintain a minimum GPA of 1.60 to be considered Satisfactory Academic Progress for the Veterans Agency. Veterans who wish to enroll and receive the educational benefits available to veterans must process their applications through the Registrar's Office of the campus where they will be studying and sign the Responsibilities as a Veterans Beneficiary document (FICPR-207). The Registrar's Office is responsible for evaluating, certifying, and monitoring the academic load of all students who receive benefits from the Veterans Administration.
